
4-H Foundation Hosts 7th Annual Flag Retirement Ceremony during 4-H Fair

The 7th Annual Flag Retirement Ceremony, a solemn event, will take place during the 4-H Fair on Saturday, July 20, 2024 at 2:00 p.m. at the flagpole near the Carol and Ralph Porch 4-H Fair Stage on the 4-H Fairgrounds, 355 Court House - South Dennis Road, Cape May Court House, New Jersey.

Ronald Day, CMC 4-H Foundation director, will coordinate the ceremony that consists of the playing of the National Anthem with the Cape May County Sheriff's Honor Guard presenting colors, patriotic readings, and an explanation of the meaning of the different parts of the flag.
